Snow guards are installed in rows in a staggered pattern along the eaves of a roof.

Placement and number of snow guards needed will vary, depending on the roofing material, pitch, snow load conditions, etc.

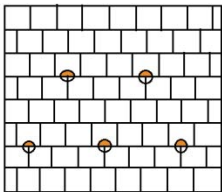

What Is a Snow Guard?

A snow Guard retention system is used to hold snow on a roof so it can melt off slowly or come off in pieces rather than in an avalanche. An avalanche of snow and ice can cause damage to: roofing material, gutters and leaders, landscaping and ornaments. Most importantly an avalanche of snow can harm people or pets below.

What Types of Roofs Can They Be Installed On?

Slate, imitation slate, tile, asphalt shingles, and wood roofs.

How Many Snow Guards Do I Need?

Generally, snow guards should be installed to 25% of the roof surface. Vermont Snow Guard Company will provide a custom layout design based on your specific climate conditions, pitch of roof, length of roof, and your aesthetic expectations.
